Mike Hasley, 76, of Montezuma passed away Wednesday morning, Feb. 26, 2025, at the Iowa City VA Medical Center. A Memorial service was held Tuesday, Mar. 4, at the Holland-Coble Funeral Home in Montezuma. Burial was held in the Jackson Township Cemetery in Montezuma.
