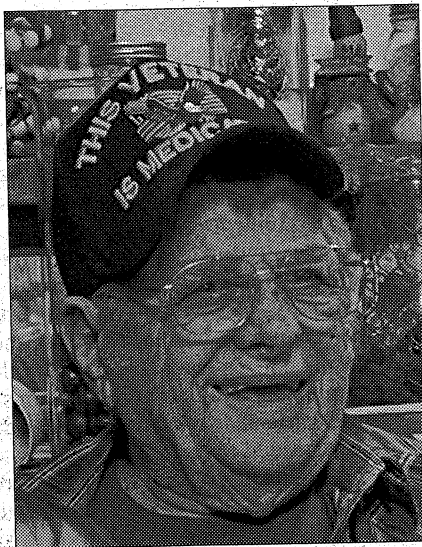


## Richard Shuler
