Dorothy Paul Polfer, 66, a native of Newburg, died of a heart ailment Sept. 29 in Eagle, Idaho.

A memorial service was conducted Oct. 3.

The daughter of William and Esther Paul, she was born Feb. 7, 1926, in Newburg. She was educated in Brooklyn and taught school in that area until her marriage to George Polfer July 16, 1946, in Sparks, Nev.
