1 Josephine H. Pollock, 102, of
2 Grinnell died Monday, March 12,
3 at the Mayflower Health Care Cen-
4 ter.

1 Funeral services were conducted
2 March 16 at Pedrick Funeral Home
3 in Keosauqua, with the Rev. Con-
4 nie Markle officiating. Burial was
5 in Fell Cemetery near Libertyville.

6 She was born Feb. 28, 1899, near
7 Libertyville to John T. and Edna
8 McLain Pollock. She was a 1917
9 graduate of Fairfield High School
10 and a 1921 graduate of Parsons
11 College. She earned her master's
12 degree in child development and
13 adult education at the University of
14 Iowa.

15 She taught in Lead, S.D., for two
16 year; worked six years for the Ex-
17 tension Service in Bozeman, Mont.;
18 was a home adviser in Monmouth,
19 Ill., for three years; and taught for
20 many years at the University of
21 Wisconsin at Madison, where she
22 was a full professor. She lived in
23 Madison from 1937 until 1975,
24 then retired to Grinnell.

25 She was a member of the United
26 Church of Christ - Congregational,
27 as well as the Wisconsin Retired
28 Teachers Association.

29 Nieces and nephews survive. She
30 was preceded in death by six broth-
31 ers, Dr. Roscoe, Thomas, Ivan,
32 Morris, Herbert and Chester and
33 three sisters, Pearl Wilson, Ruth
34 Culbertson and Edna Knudsen.
