

Businessman Found Dead At Monte *HR*

Perry Pribble Dies
Sunday in IHC Shop;
Perform Autopsy

An autopsy was to be performed today (Monday) to determine the cause of the death of Perry Pribble, about 50, who died Sunday afternoon in the shop of the International Harvester agency which he operated in Montezuma.

Dr. W. B. Phillips, coroner, said that Pribble had gone to his place of business about 2:30 o'clock Sunday. At 4:30 he was found dead near the furnace by his son, Bob.

The coroner listed possible cause of death as a coronary thrombosis or electrocution from a wire hanging near the furnace. Dr. C. R. Phelps of Ottumwa, registered pathologist, was scheduled to perform the autopsy at Monte today.

Pribble is survived by his wife and two children, Bob and Jean, and his parents, who are making their home with the Pribbles. Bob, a student at Iowa university, is married to the former Joan Hamilton of Grinnell.
