Carl E. Prince, 62, of 620 State St., Grinnell, died Wednesday evening at Grinnell General Hospital. Jan. 27

Funeral services were conducted at 10:30 a.m. Saturday at the Grinnell First Baptist Church, with the Rev. Robert C. Smith officiating. Organist was Edward Bohstedt, and vocalist was Dorothy Smith.
