Eva L. Pring, 92, of the Mayflower died Monday, July 18, at the Mayflower Health Care Center.

A memorial service will be held at 2 p.m. Saturday, July 30, in Denison Chapel at the Mayflower, with the Rev. Paul Jordan officiating. Music will be provided by pianist Norman Goodbrod and vocalist Marvin Kelley. Burial will be at Huntsville, Ind.

Memorial contributions in her name may be made to the Mayflower Human Needs Fund.

The daughter of William and Stella Pring, she was born June 25, 1902, in Pendleton, Ind. She was a 1920 graduate of Pendleton High School and attended Indiana University where she received her A.B. degree in English and Latin and her master's degree in counseling.

She had taught in elementary schools at Pendleton and at the high school in Boonville, Ind., before going to Bloomington High School where she served as a teacher and counselor from 1927 to 1942. During World War II she worked as a vocational counselor at the YWCA in Chicago while working for her Ph.D. at Northwestern University, which she completed in 1946.

Dr. Pring was dean and teacher at Oak Park-River Forest High School, Oak Park, Ill., from 1944 to 1960. She served as a counselor and teacher at Lyons Township High School in LaGrange, Ill., from 1960 to 1966. In 1966 she was sent by the United Church Board for World Ministries to the American Collegiate Institute in Izmir, Turkey, as a missionary teacher and counselor. She retired in 1970 and moved to the Mayflower. While here, she was a member of the United Church of Christ-Congregational and a volunteer teacher and tutor of students in the Grinnell school system.

She was a member of Phi Beta Kappa, Pi Lambda Theta and Delta Kappa Gamma. She also was a member of the Illinois and National Associations of Women Deans and Counselors.

There are no immediate survivors. She was preceded in death by her parents and two sisters, Mary Zion and Mildred Steiner.
