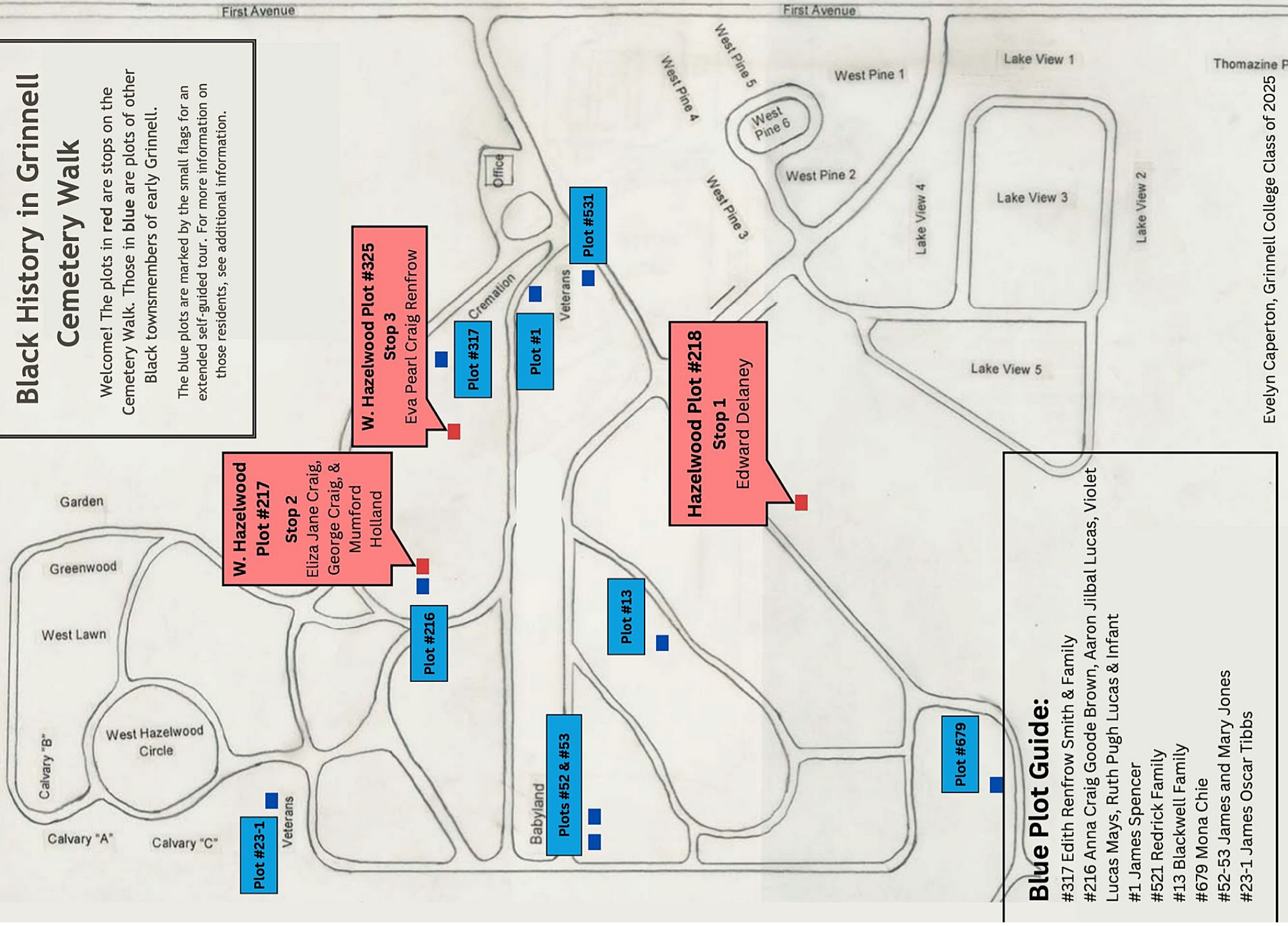


Black History in Grinnell Cemetery Walk
